# Architect's Report Quaker Hill School: Jacunski Humes, LLC

Mr. Jacunski reported that the Punch List is 99.9% done.

# Construction Manager's Report Quaker Hill School: O & G Industries

Mr. Giacobbe reported that Dicin Electric is out there today finishing up some work. Beebe was out there on Monday scrapping the pervious pavers and getting them as per plans and specs. TruGreen will be doing the lawns to get the Play Fields in good condition so Parks and Rec can take over. TruGreen will reseed, water, and fertilize. This will be a charge back to Beebe.

1. Discussion and possible action on proposal dated July 13, 2010 from TruGreen to do the remedial work at Quaker Hill. They will be fertilizing, aerating, seeding, and irrigating prior to school starting in an effort to get the lawns playable for the students. The watering of the lawns is not included in the attached proposal - that will be at a cost of \$385/day, with an expected need of 10-14 days of watering, depending on the weather. In addition to the attached, they will be mowing the lawns next week for \$434.00. All of these costs will be back charged to Beebe.

Mr. Koning reported that he received a phone call from Parks and Rec regarding the stones in the playing fields. Mr. Giacobbe stated that the play fields will be brought up to good condition before Parks and Rec take over.

# VII. OSWEGATCHIE SCHOOL

#### VIII. GREAT NECK SCHOOLL

Architect's Report Great Neck School: Jacunski Humes, LLC

Mr. Jacunski reported that the FF&E orders are on schedule; he spoke to Sheri Rowley of Advent Design and they see no reason why the FF&E orders would be delayed. Everything should be there for the start of school. Sheri Rowley explained that there were no bids for the flags, flag holders and pencil sharpeners, so they will have to be purchased separately. Yesterday they completed the last section of the Interior Punch List items, but they have not done any of the Exterior Punch List items. Mr. Jacunski said his Landscape Architect has been out to the site and has gathered a few items that will go onto the Official Punch List.

# Construction Manager's Report Great Neck School: O & G

Mr. Kotait reported that they will do the final paving the week of August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2010. They will be going for the TCO (Temporary Certificate of Occupancy) on Thursday.

Mr. Jacunski said there should be two trailer trucks with furniture arriving tomorrow.

# IX. WATERFORD HIGH SCHOOL Architect's Report Waterford High School: Jeter, Cook, & Jepson

Mr. Smolley reported that the plans have been approved by the Bureau of School Facilities. The Traffic Permit is approved, and the Department of Environmental Protection has signed off on the slope of the football field that was near the flood plain. Tom Wagner is reviewing the Planning and Zoning corrections. All the drawings are at Tom Wagner's office now. The test for PCBs on the materials tested was okay. So there will not be a problem disposing of the materials. The test is 0 - 1 PCBs is okay. 1 - 50,000 PCBs requires a State Permit, and over 50,000 requires EPA to become involved. The test is done as waste is disposed at the disposal site. If the materials are tested and found to be over the limit, there is a fine assessed retroactively starting at \$18,000. The materials tested had no PCBs so the material is non-hazardous. The rigging for the stage is being researched. A manual or electric wench could be used. They will gather the facts to see which one would be best and cost effective.

Mr. Wilensky asked when they will be going out to bid. Mr. Smolley said they will go out after the parties sign off on the PCBs. The drawings are all set to obtain the Building Permits. There will be a State Fee for the Building Permits. The scheduling will be redone after the bids are received. The construction schedule is delayed, but not critically at this point. Discussions are being held on the adult and student parking areas. The Welcome Back Letter will outline the new construction schedule. The building could be a Green Building, LEEDS Construction, or High Performance School Construction. There will be no un-building done. To keep costs down, the Renovate to New designation will include code considerations only. The Budget will be 75-80% code requirements and 20-25% fix up.

Mr. Hoagland distributed a packet of Existing Floor Plans – ADA Scope, Renovation Scope, Field House, Auditorium, Band Room, Auxiliary Gym, and Pool. He discussed the code requirements, program changes, additions and alterations, as well as the seating, guardrails, plumbing fixtures, doors, hardware, fire alarms, sprinkler systems, existing items, security systems, air handling units, floors, and new power/data locations. Painting will not be done in some areas to keep costs down; the old scoreboard is in good condition and will not be replaced. Mr. Brule and Mrs. Nazarchyk disagreed with Mr. Smolley; they feel that painting should be done in the areas that the Town uses most. Floors may not be replaced in some areas. Dividers may not be replaced. Mr. Smolley stated that some replacements may not be reimbursable and will need to be included in the Capital Improvement Plan. Some items could be added as an Add Alternate.

Mrs. Nazarchyk said that the wooden floors seem to be better than the rubber floors. The rubber floors seem to be involved in knee injuries in tearing of the ACL on some members of the girls's teams. Mr. Smolley will take the comments under consideration. Mr. Smolley hopes that they can go out to bid in a couple of weeks.
