VI. QUAKER HILL SCHOOL

Architect's Report Quaker Hill School: Jacunski Humes LLC

Mr. Jacunski reported that they are reviewing the Punch List items for any issues. They received a site drawing from the contractor yesterday. The Civil Engineer was at the site at the beginning of the month to check several items. There are no major items. The site looks like it is nearing completion. O & G is in the process of working out the remaining issues with the mason, and hopefully all the issues should be wrapped up by the end of the year.

Construction Manager's Report Quaker Hill School: O & G

Mr. Giacobbe reported that there are a couple of issues they are working on, one is the lighting issue and the snow guards. The landscape issues should be completed on Thursday.

VII. OSWEGATCHIE SCHOOL

Architect's Report Oswegatchie School: Jacunski Humes, LLC

Mr. Jacunski reported that all the Punch Lists have been issued except the roof. They are having a bit of a problem getting Greenwood Industries back there because there is some ponding water on the roof. Most of the interior Punch Lists have been completed. They will not sign off on the roof until Greenwood takes care of the issues. Mr. Biega suggested that the manufacturer be called in to look at the problem. Mr. Jacunski will call them.

Construction Manager's Report OSW School: O & G 1. Monthly Progress Report #21

Mr. Kotait reported that the interior Punch Lists are virtually completed. There is a section of ceiling tiles that will be changed. Balancing is still being adjusted, and they are tweaking the HVAC.

VIII. GREAT NECK SCHOOL

Architect's Report Great Neck School: Jacunski Humes, LLC

Mr. Jacunski reported that they are working with the Construction Manager at O & G Industries on Shop Drawings which are mostly done. Everything is going well with a few minor steel item issues.

Construction Manager's Report Great Neck School: O & G 1. Monthly Progress Report #5

Mr. Kotait reported that everything is on schedule. Masonry on Building A is all wrapped up. Mason is working on the Gym now. Interior masonry on first floor is okay. They are concentrating on the second floor now. Windows will be started next week. The paving of the final course will be done by the end of the month.

2. Discussion re: decision on cupola

Mr. Jacunski distributed sketches of the proposed Cupola which is placed behind the building near the Basketball Court at Great Neck School. The sketch shows the Cupola elevated on a masonry structure with benches around it, and the third sketch shows an arial view. There are other sketches, but this sketch is the most popular. There are sketches that show an area that has doors that open and one can walk into the cupola, but there is a lot of liability concerned with that version. Dr. Collins asked if the dental work on the bottom was new. Mr. Jacunski said that the cupola would be cut just below the dental work. Mr. Wilensky asked if there would be a charge for the design. Mr. Jacunski will get some real numbers for the restoration, removal of the lead paint, new paint, etc.

NEW OSWEGATCHIE PLAQUE

Before Mr. Jacunski left the meeting, he presented Waterford Public Schools with the new Oswegatchie plaque that replaces the plaque that had some problems. Mr. Jacunski said it is a gift from him to Waterford Public Schools.

IX. WATERFORD HIGH SCHOOL

Mr. James Hoagland, JCJ Architecture, showed artist renderings of the new construction for the high school. They have had meetings with the staff at the high school, they have a design development package that O & G is processing, and there should be prices forthcoming for the next meeting. They are going into the regulatory process with Planning and Zoning about the wetlands, and they are getting close to making an application. Thursday there will be an informal presentation. Today there was a meeting with the Superintendent on the design development package. Color selections for specific spaces on the interior design are being made. They expect some geo technical information this week. They will be getting specific designs of the louvers and other designs of the original images. Mr. Hoagland showed renderings of the three-story academic building, the tennis courts, access road to Miner Lane, and the wetlands area. Updated floor plans of the new addition were shown, and the orchestra room is being taken out to allow easier egress from the main entrance. Signage will be needed along the colonnade, and the pitch roof will hide the air handling equipment. The two buildings will be connected on the second floor. There should be ample student parking.
