All grade levels are wrapping up a wave of assessments to determine where our teachers need to focus instruction. This data will also be used to determine if students will receive math or literacy intervention.

Our intervention tiers are as follows:

Tier 1: Universal Instruction: This tier encompasses high-quality, evidence-based instruction provided to all students in the general education classroom. It's designed to meet the needs of the majority of students. Teachers use effective teaching strategies and monitor student progress regularly.

Tier 2: Targeted Intervention: Students who don't make adequate progress in Tier 1 are provided with additional support in small groups or individually by an academic interventionist. These interventions are more focused and specific to the students' needs. Progress is closely monitored, and adjustments are made as necessary.

Tier 3: Intensive Intervention: At this level, students who continue to struggle receive highly individualized and intensive interventions. These interventions are tailored to address specific learning challenges. Progress is rigorously monitored, and data guides decision-making.

Students that continue to show difficulties after Tier 3 interventions over time may be considered for Special Education evaluations.

Throughout September, intervention support was through a push-in model to support the transition into the classroom community and routines. We will now be transitioning to the typical push-in and pull-out approaches to interventions.

Please reach out to your child's teacher throughout the year if you have questions about their progress or particular academic concerns.

As many of you may have heard, the government is planning on opening up free Covid test kits via COVID.gov as of MONDAY SEPTEMBER 25, 2023.

How to prepare for a fall or winter Covid-19 surge

Though late summer has brought a surge of Covid-19 due largely to new variants, it's possible the fall and winter seasons may bring another uptick in infections. If you're looking for ways to protect yourself in addition to stocking up on tests, updated booster shots are now available.

The CDC recommends everyone ages 6 months and older receive a new Moderna or Pfizer vaccination to protect against serious illness.

The symptoms for the latest Covid-19 variant making waves, EG.5 or "Eris," are similar to those of previous strains and can include:

- Fatigue
- Sore throat
- Runny nose
- Fever
- Muscle aches
- Loss of taste and smell

If you're feeling under the weather with some or all of those symptoms, it's a good idea to take a test.

ANNUAL PRE K INFLUENZA VACCINATION is a REQUIREMENT for school attendance, and proof must be provided in writing prior to December 31, 2023 to allow your child to return from the Holiday break. . Please schedule your Pre K student for their vaccination early.

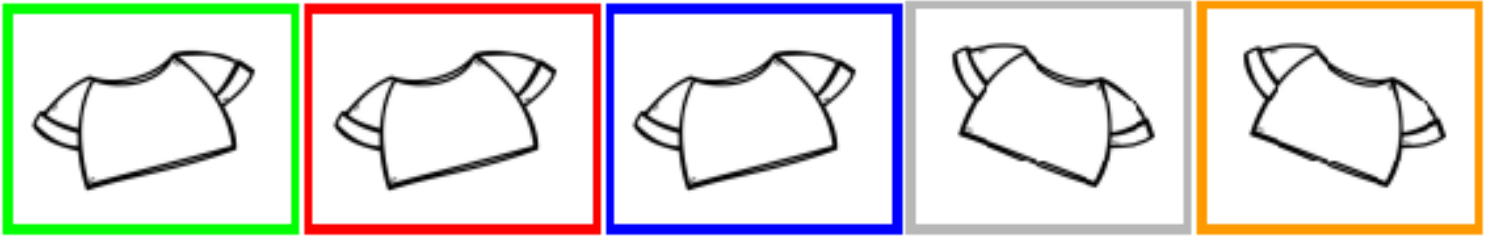

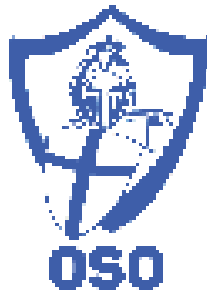

UCFS Healthcare's School-Based Health Centers and Your School!



The UCFS school-based health centers (SBHC) are a doctor's office inside of your school. The services are provided by an APRN (advanced practice registered nurse)/PA (Physician Assistant) and licensed behavioral health clinician who are experts in adolescent health and are employed by UCFS. The intention of the UCFS SBHC is to supplement the care your child receives at their pediatrician's office.

Services Provided



- Yearly well-child examinations
- Vaccinations
- Sports physicals
- Acute care visits (e.g. sick visits, lacerations, injuries, etc.)
- Chronic care visits (e.g. asthma, ADHD, etc.)
- Mental Health Assessments
- Substance Abuse Screenings
- Counseling (individual, group, and family)

Top 5 Reasons to use the School-Based Health Center

- Convenient same day appointment.
- Removes barriers to care such as lack of transportation.
- Decreases time away from the classroom which improves academic success.
- Improves student's achievement by taking care of behavioral health needs that can make learning difficult.
- Connects students and their families with insurance coverage.

- Behavioral Health Referrals can come from students, teachers, counselors, administrators as well as parents/guardians of students.
- Medical visits can be coordinated through the school nurse or directly with our family engagement/medical assistant.
